English

Punctuation and Grammar: using commas in a list, apostrophes for omission and possession. Comprehension activities on a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts including topic-based comprehensions.

Headstart spelling and phonics.

Writing for different purposes including invitation writing, book reviews, character profiles, diary writing and story writing based on Katie Morag and Grandad's Island.

Handwriting.

Individual /Group reading.

Music

Charanga music: Zootime

Using the theme of animals, children will listen, appraise and perform reggae music.

Maths

Adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers by counting on/back in tens and ones, and using this to work with money and find change.

Using number bonds, number facts and doubles to work out more complicated calculations including finding small differences either side of a multiple of 10.

Measuring weight and capacity using standard and non-standard units of measure and putting data into block graphs. Finding fractions of numbers.

YEAR TWO TOPIC: ISLAND LIVING

ICT

We are Researchers: The children will look at how to break down a topic by choosing questions to answer, understanding how to safely research online and how to put their findings into a simple presentation.

Art and Design Technology

Art inspired by the Katie Morag books including watercolour landscapes and pastel character portraits. Card making for Easter and Mother's Day.

DT: understanding how wheels work using axels and designing our own moving vehicles.

History/Geography

The children will learn about island living through the Katie Morag books set in the Hebrides. They will consider how life there is similar and different to life in Bath. We will look at transport, weather, jobs and family life on the fictional Isle of Struay.

Physical Education/ Outdoor Learning

Gym: linking movements through floor work and using apparatus.

Games: throwing and catching skills in a range of outdoor sports.

We will be using our Wild Wednesdays to do outdoor activities to boost positive mental health. This will include gardening, physical exercise and team building activities.
