Morning Drop-Off

Class Dojo

Beginning on Wednesday 15th September, following the use of ClassDojo during periods of home learning in the last school year, we have decided to use the same platform for communication between teachers and families, and for the sharing of some learning this year. We hope that Dojo will provide a quick and easy way for teachers to share information with you all via the Class Story, and that it will also allow you to ask questions directly to your child's teacher using the messaging function. Teachers will aim to respond to questions on ClassDojo within 24 hours, and on the same day where possible, if the message arrives before 4.30pm. We hope that you will understand that teachers will not be monitoring ClassDojo during teaching hours (9.00am – 3.30pm) nor at weekends. With this in mind, **for communication that relates to attendance and lunches, we ask that you still use the normal channels through the school office to get in touch with the school.**

Pick-Up Messages for your child's teacher

If you need to change the pickup arrangement for your child on a given day or on a permanent basis, this information should still be handed to the class teacher (or another member of staff in the absence of the teacher) in written form at morning drop-off. The note must be clearly labelled with the teacher's name and class. These notes are held on file so that any adult working with the class can check them at pick-up time. Except in the case of a genuine emergency, changes to pick-up arrangements should not be sent to the office, by phone or email.

Safety at Drop-Off and Pick-Up

Please may we politely remind all parents of the importance of taking the utmost care when dropping off or collecting pupils by car. Please **do not under any circumstances** park across the school entrance, on the yellow zigzag lines outside school or on the double yellow lines in Broadmoor Lane and always be extra vigilant of the safety of all parents and pupils arriving at school or leaving the school site on foot.

Administrative Matters

- **IMPORTANT: Requests to Take Pupils on Holiday During School Term Time.** At WASPS our aim is to prepare pupils for their future lives and careers. With this in mind, we ask parents to observe the school holidays as prescribed. Given how much schooling many pupils have missed over the last year, it is more important than ever that any absence is limited to reasons of illness or other circumstances of an **exceptional** nature. In those cases, a 'request for absence' should be forwarded to the Headteacher.

Please note that if a holiday is taken without authorisation then the details may be passed to the Children Missing Education Officer and a fine may be incurred.



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- **IMPORTANT: Absence due to illness.** If your child is poorly and due to be attending school, please do not forget to register your child's absence either by telephoning the School Office on 421786 and leaving an answerphone message, or by sending an email to the school on attendance@wasp-school.org.uk The email link is accessible via the website too.

Please make sure you have contacted the school by 9.15am at the latest on the morning of the absence, stating the reason and nature of the illness, or the symptoms. Unfortunately, we can no longer accept "ill" or "poorly" without further detail. If your child is suffering from vomiting and/or diarrhoea, **please note** that your child needs to be clear of all symptoms for 48 hours before returning to school.

- **Fruit or Veg for Morning Break and Packed Lunches.** We noticed last year that some children were bringing snacks to school other than fruit or veg for morning break. All children in KS1 (Reception to Year 2) are given a piece of fruit or vegetable for morning break. KS2 children are encouraged to bring a piece of fruit or veg from home, but no other snacks or sweets. **Please do not send anything containing nuts** as we have children in school with nut allergies.
- **Drinks in School.** We encourage water for the children but no other drinks in school please.

B&NES Free Courses - Cook It, LEAP & Henry Healthy Families

Please see the fliers at the end of the newsletter and the following information from the Children's healthy weight team for Virgin Care's Wellbeing Service that are available to parents in B&NES:

Cook It is currently being delivered online and is a 5-week programme that aims to motivate and provide families with the skills and confidence to plan, prepare and cook healthy budget friendly family meals and to improve knowledge about healthy eating by covering topics such as eat well plate, portion sizes, healthy snacks.

Henry Healthy Families is an online 8-week evidence-based programme which supports families with young children to give them a great start in life and encourages a healthier lifestyle for the whole family. The programme supports physical and emotional wellbeing and covers nutrition, physical activity, portion sizes, screen time, looking after yourself, exploring children's and parent's feelings and managing challenging behaviour. It's a relaxed and informal online course which gives parents the opportunity to share experiences and ideas with other parents. Each parent receives a free set of helpful family resources – a course book, which includes recipe and activity ideas; children's story books and soft ball, charts and more. LEAP is also an online course, offering 1:1 support for children (with their family) aged 5-10 and 10-17, it is for 6 weeks. The topics covered include, healthy food and drink swaps, physical activity, impact of screen time and why we make certain food choices. Tailored goals are then set after every session and each child/parent receives a family booklet and session plan. After the course finishes we offer 3 months of free leisure centre activities (including 1 adult).

REMINDERS

Drop-off and Pick-up

- Gates open at 8.40am
- Drop-off promptly at 8.50am
- Pick-up at 3.20pm

Entry/exit points:

- Lansdown Lane gate near Little WASPS – Reception and Year 1.
- First Broadmoor Lane gate, at the top of the staff drive – Years 2 – 6 if approaching from Lansdown Lane.
- Main gate on Broadmoor Lane, leading to main school office – Years 2 – 6 if approaching from beyond the main gate.

One-way routes are marked on the two driveways. The bark path is one-way from the first Broadmoor Lane gate towards the main driveway.

Covid-19 – Please remember:

- Face coverings are personal choice
- To respect those who wish to adhere to the 2 metre social distancing guidelines
- To respond promptly if anyone in the household develops Covid symptoms (see <https://www.wasp-school.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2021/01/Covid-19-A-quick-guide-for-parents-and-carers-04.01.21.pdf> A Quick Guide for Parents and Carers)

Please remember, it is really important, due to the reported transmissibility of the delta variant, that if your child is coughing or has a raised temperature or experiences a change in their taste or smell, that you book a PCR test without delay. The household is required to isolate until a negative result is received. Please be clear that the Lateral Flow home tests are intended for testing asymptomatic people, **i.e. people without symptoms.**

Anyone with symptoms needs to ring 119 to book a PCR test. Public Health England recommend that children with non-COVID specific symptoms of acute respiratory infection don't go into school if they are unwell as a general rule, and get tested if they (or their families) progress to COVID 19 symptoms whilst unwell.

We believe this is because some people who have caught the Delta variant of the virus recently, have reported feeling 'as if they had a summer cold, with headache, sore throat, runny nose, sneezing' for the first few days. Only a few days later have the 'typical' Covid symptoms become apparent.

IMPORTANT, PLEASE NOTE - ANY close contacts of Covid cases who have been asked to isolate (including siblings who attend other schools and who are isolating) are NOT permitted to come onto the school site for any reason, including the drop-off or collection of pupils from WASPS. Thank you.

Regular Covid-19 Testing for Adults - Residents in B&NES are being encouraged to get into the habit of having a regular rapid Covid-19 test. Lockdown restrictions are slowly being loosened across England in line with **the Government's Roadmap**, and whilst these changes are really welcomed they also bring with them an increased risk of transmission. To reduce risk and keep everyone safe, it is vital to keep testing at home:

- adults test twice a week at home from now on (all those who can)
- report results online as positive, negative or void. This information is critical in helping to understand the prevalence of the virus across the country
